महाशय,

निदेशानुसार उपर्युक्त विषयक विभागीय पत्रांक 2216 दिनांक 12.07.2005 की ओर ध्यान आकृष्ट करते हुए कहना है कि अन्य राज्यों के आरक्षित वर्ग के उम्मीदवार जो इस राज्य में वासित हैं, उन्हें भारत सरकार, गृह मंत्रालय के पत्र संख्या-बी.सी.-16014/1/82 एस.सी. और बी.सी.डी.-I दिनांक 18.11.1982 में दिये गये दिशा निर्देश के आलोक में जाति प्रमाण पत्र निर्गत करने हेतु निदेश दिया गया है। भारत सरकार, गृह मंत्रालय द्वारा उक्त पत्र का प्रतिस्थापन बी.सी.-16014/1/82 एस.सी. एवं बी.सी.डी.-I दिनांक 22.02.1985 द्वारा किया गया है, जिसके कारण भारत सरकार के पत्र संख्या- 16014/1/82 एस.सी. और बी.सी.डी.-I दिनांक 18.11.1982 का अवक्रमण हो चुका है।

अतः अनुरोध है कि भारत सरकार, गृह मंत्रालय के पत्र संख्या -16014/1/82 एस.सी. और बी.सी.डी.-I दिनांक 22.02.1985 (छाया प्रति संलग्न) में दिये गये दिशा निर्देश के आलोक में जाति प्रमाण पत्र निर्गत करने हेतु आवश्यक कार्रवाई करने की कृपा की जाए।

तदनुसार विभागीय पत्रांक 2216 दिनांक 12.07.2005 को इस हद तक संशोधित समझा जाए।

SUBJECT—Issue of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Certificate to migrants from other States/Union Territories.

SIR,

I am directed to say that it has been represented to this Ministry that persons belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, who have migrated from one State to another for the purpose of employment, education, etc. experience great difficulty in obtaining caste/tribe certificate from the State from which they have migrated. In order to remove this difficulty, it has been decided to modify the instructions issued in Letter No. B.C. 12025/2/76-S.C.T.-I, dated the 22nd March 1977 and Letter No. B.C. 12025/11/79-S.C. and B. C. D.-I.IV dated the 29th March 1982 that the prescribed authority of a State Government/Union Territory Administration may issue the Scheduled Caste/Tribe certificate to a person who has migrated from another State, on the production of the genuine certificate issued to his father by the prescribed authority of the State of the father's origin except where the prescribed authority feels that detailed enquiry is necessary through the State of origin before issue of the certificate. The certificate will be issued irrespective of whether the caste/tribe in question is scheduled or not in relation to the State/Union Territory to which the person has migrated. This facility does not alter the Scheduled Caste/Tribe status of the person in relation to the one or the other State. The revised form of the Scheduled Caste/Tribe certificate has already been circulated with this Ministry's letter of even number, dated the 6th August 1984.

2. It is also clarified that a Scheduled Caste/Tribe person who has migrated from the State of origin to some other State for the purpose of seeking education, employment, etc. will be deemed to be a Scheduled Caste/Tribe of the State of his origin and will be entitled to derive benefits from the State of origin and not from the State to which he has migrated.

3. This letter substitutes this Ministry's earlier letter of even number, dated the 18th November 1982.
